2022 came with its challenges - with hard punches that were hard to avoid, yet we learned and grew through all of it. For example, external fundraising was a hard nut for us to crack, yet our skill in internal fundraising and leveraging the resources we had to get things going has been a superpower.

Our team on the ground had more physical outreaches to schools in Afon Community (where we have our Headquarters) than the previous year, despite the 'limited' financial resources.

We are convinced that these lessons will be useful for the team and in our programs in the months and years. We partnered with the Keeping It Real (KIR) Foundation (KIR) to mark this year's World Childrens Day with the children and students at the NYSC Nursery and Primary school Afon, Kwara State. 2022 Lessons Learned

 Volunteer Management: despite increasing the number of days for onboarding new volunteers, we learned that reaching out to potential volunteers within 30 days of their application works better. Also, we need to have a budget to compensate volunteers
 for example, internet costs or offer to loan out computers to them where necessary.

3. Participant Signups: 600+ people from over 20 African countries signed up for our Virtual Makerspace. Less than 20% of them joined the dedicated Telegram group. As great as the #PrikkleCoffeeRoulette is, the feedback from the group is that they want a transformative 'program' that could awaken more possibilities in them. We'll do a program launch in 2023.

2. Process Flow: Most of our team members know what to do, and at what time, yet without a documented process flow (especially mapping out the journey of anyone that joins us - either a volunteer, participant or mentor - things become disorganized at different points.

4. Leveraging Internal Resources Better: Work wasn't as distributed as it should be and there was a gap in following through on implementation - as observed with the onboarded volunteers. We had to launch a space for Profession mentors to sign up as Volunteers to increase our human resources via our Google Ads.

5. Academic and Practitioners: Our work is relevant in the academic community. We're practitioners, yet. we should intentionally contribute to world of research.

2023 Action Points

LAUNCH of Prikkle SPARKLE Program (PSP) in Virtual Makerspace (2 Cohorts)
Towards activating youth job creation and initiating community projects.

Implement redesigned process flow for our community of volunteers, mentors and participants

Regular sharing of impact stories, plus Intentional and active fundraising

Facilitate strategic partnerships - specifically related to Employability, MEAL, Fundraising, Capacity Building and Entrepreneurship

Leverage tech tools, for Nonprofits, for productivity and impact.
